Museum News for the first week of January 2023

As a new year begins, we look back and are grateful for all those who make things possible at the Sargent County Museum. We are also looking forward to those who continue to give back and make a positive impact on what we do to preserve our history. The Sargent County Historical Society works to support the communities we live in. We work on the items in our care at the museum but also preserving for the future. We just applied for a grant to have all the newspapers ever printed in the county to be digitized and put on the World Wide Web for all to see. We found out on Dec. 23 that we received that grant. We need to come up with 25% of the cost to do the project for the grant, so we are looking to raise \$6000 of which we have had \$3500 come in by year end donations. Funding projects like digitizing the newspapers and supporting programs that enhance educational experiences at the museum are also part of what we do. When you donate to the Sargent County Historical Society or Museum, you are helping make a difference in preserving our history and fulfilling a desire to give back and positively impact our communities. As you consider you're giving this year, please remember the joy and satisfaction of supporting organizations like the Sargent County Museum and the positive difference you can make through your generosity. We are the county museum, but we only get around \$10,000 a year to run the museum from the county, were our expenses run around \$30,000 a year and that does not take into consideration special projects like digitizing the newspapers. 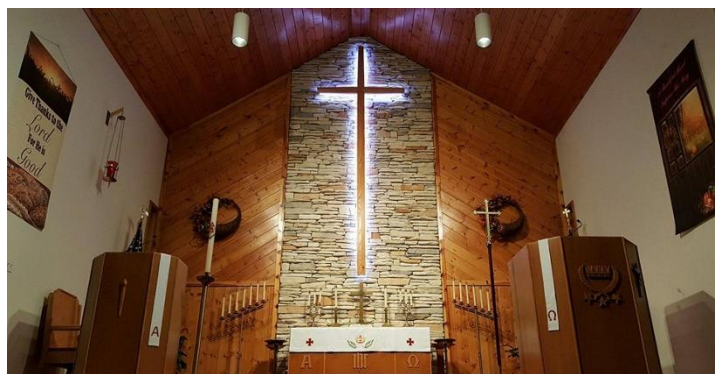
